

Recycling Information

All aluminum, metal, glass and plastic articles to be recycled must be placed in bins, buckets or other containers and clearly marked "**Recycling.**" All paper must be separated from commingle and placed in brown paper bags or tied with string.

Acceptable materials for recycling:

Commingled: Items may be placed in Red Bin

- **Glass-Green, Brown & Clear:** Bottles or Jars only. Rinse clean. Remove lids and rings. Labels may be left on. NO plate glass, ceramics, drinking glasses, etc.
- **Plastic:** Must be marked with #1 and #2 inside triangle on bottom. Rinse clean. Remove lids and discard. Labels may be left on. NO unmarked containers or containers marked with other than #1 and #2 inside the triangle on the bottom. No antifreeze or motor oil containers.
- **Aluminum Beverage Cans:** Rinse clean. Cans can be flattened. No bottom or jar lids, no pie plates or aluminum foil. NO other aluminum items.
- **Bi-Metal Cans:** Rinse clean. Cans can be flattened. Examples include pet food cans, soup cans, vegetable cans. NO cans with plastic parts. NO paint cans or aerosol cans.

Paper Products: Bundle with twine or brown paper bags

- Newspapers
- Phone books
- Junk mail
- Magazines
- White and Ledger paper
- Corrugated (cardboard boxes flattened)
- Paperboard (cereal type boxes)
- Envelopes (with and without windows)
- Colored paper

Cardboard Boxes: Must be cut in three foot squares, tied and placed next to the recycle bin. This is necessary because of the compacting system of the recycle truck. If the cardboard is not prepared in this way it will be taken with the regular trash. Cereal boxes and similar cardboard items may be combined with the newspaper.

Unacceptable materials for recycling:

- Plate glass
- Aluminum foil
- Pizza boxes
- Five gallon buckets
- Paper towels
- Plastic bags
- Window tempered glass
- Aluminum trays
- Flower pots
- Tissues
- Oil, transmission fluid

Yard Waste: May be included in regular pick up. Bags of grass not to exceed 20 lbs. with a limit of 5 bags per pick up. Branches acceptable in tied bundles no longer than 3 feet in length.
